<u>Children Medical Services (CMS)</u>

Health Services - for <u>eligible</u> infants, children, adolescents, and young adults who have on-going physical or behavioral conditions.

The Children's Medical Services (CMS) Network serves eligible children with chronic and serious special health care needs from birth to age 21. CMS Network eligibility is based on a child's age, financial eligibility and clinical eligibility

Medicaid

Medicaid provides medical coverage to low-income individuals and families. Medicaid services in Florida are administered by the Agency for Health Care Administration.

Medicaid eligibility in Florida is determined either by the Department of Children and Families (DCF) or the Social Security Administration (for SSI recipients).

Healthy Bodies: A Parent's Guide on Puberty for Adolescents With Disabilities – This toolkit was developed to help support an adolescent with a disability going through puberty. It is appropriate for a broad range of disabilities and provides a variety of visual supports and social stories that deal simply and directly with the practical matters of puberty. There is a misperception that children with disabilities will also be delayed in puberty and the development of their sexuality - which isn't necessary the truth. By empowering adolescents with an understanding of their bodies it will help reduce anxiety in difficult situations and increase independence.
